Subject: Tesla Supercharger Site

To the Tracy City Council, and any party interested.

I, along with many other residents of the city of Tracy and surrounding cities, have found ourselves at a disadvantage as of late. I have been in contact with several Tesla owner clubs and vehicle owners in the San Joaquin Valley, Silicon Valley, and other surrounding areas and we are surprised that unlike other neighboring areas, Tracy still does not have a Supercharging Station of our own.

For that reason, we are finding ourselves having to charge in other cities, which is fine but extremely inconvenient, for both us and the businesses that we could be supporting within the Tracy City limits as opposed to say, Manteca, which has two stations, or Stockton, who has one fully operational and another under construction. It's also incredibly inconvenient for those who pass through the city while on their daily commute seeing as the Alameda Corridor contains no Supercharger until you reach the outskirts of Livermore.

Now, I know that cost and location are a troublesome thing to work out, and planning is a nightmare, but what I thought worth mentioning is the fact that Tesla themselves cover the cost of construction and any other expenses that may arise. All that the city would need to offer is a couple of parking spaces anywhere within the City that would be willing to host a Supercharging Station, for example, Target in the past has worked closely with Tesla themselves to set up Stations in their parking lots, or near the Transit Station in the Downtown area. Anywhere would work. It would increase business foot traffic while charging, restaurant patronage, etc.

I urge you to please take a look into any of the possibilities, and I have been told personally by the head of the Tesla owner club of San Joaquin that he would personally fast track the application process to Tesla if anyone were to show interest in hosting a site. If the City themselves can't spare a couple parking spots, please don't hesitate to point me in the direction of a private business or organization that might be interested so I can put them in contact with the proper people.
