5. NEW BUSINESS:

a. Receive Update on Temporary Traffic Signal Operation and the Status of a Permanent Signal at Valpico Road and Corral Hollow Road

Anju Pillai, Senior Civil Engineer, presented the Corral Hollow Corridor project, its background, the purpose of the temporary traffic signal at Valpico Rd until the permanent traffic control system is installed, and website information for future construction updates. Commission discussion and comments followed on safety, survey feedback, accidents, truck route, and traffic gridlock.

Jean Andreas, Tracy resident, addressed various safety concerns navigating the busy intersection after the new temporary traffic signal had been installed, especially turning left without a protected turn signal. She requested that the City considers bringing back the 4-way stop to prevent accidents.

Gregory Faulkner, Tracy resident, described an accident at another intersection that resulted in his injuries and disability and pleaded that City considers safety a priority when implementing a traffic signal system.

Tracy resident Rosario mentioned numerous challenges and the gridlock during commute hours instead of mitigating the existing traffic congestion due to the new developments. He also commented on the long wait until a permanent signal is installed.

Ven, Tracy resident, requested City to take an urgent approach to correct the issues at the intersection to prevent accidents. Since the temporary signal was installed, he has observed various issues and challenges navigating the corridor.

b. Receive Update on TRACER Pilot Route H to Arbor Road Homeless Shelter

Ed Lovell, Transit Manager, provided information on the new pilot Route H, implemented to meet the transportation needs of riders to and from Arbor. Commission discussion and questions followed on ridership, fare, bus accessibility, safety, expansion of the route, and COVID protocols.

- **c.** Review and Provide Input on the Annual Commission Report to City Council. Commission reviewed the report and discussed the various Commission activities and outreach they participated in FY 21-22. Commissioner Silva agreed to present the report to the City Council.
- d. Provide Input on Commission Goals and Objectives for FY22/23 Staff provided information on the customized canopy purchased for outreach. The route

restructuring draft will be presented to Commission for review and feedback in March. Commission comments followed.

<u>Commissioner Silva</u>: Commented on the recent traffic accidents on 11th Street and other fatal accidents on the City streets and pedestrian crosswalks. He suggested a conversation at the TAC to promote safe sidewalks and crosswalks and the opportunity for grant funding or another funding source available for such projects.

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TRACER Ridership: A year-to-date comparison of current ridership compared to the same period in the previous year is shown below. Fixed route ridership is up 8,086 riders compared to the year-to-date ridership in November FY21/22, an increase of approximately 24%. Paratransit ridership is up 1,636 riders compared to the same time in November FY21/22, an increase of approximately 36%. Overall the Tracer system ridership has increased by 9,722 riders over the same period last year, an overall increase of approximately 26%
