




2021 Business Breakdown

Workforce & Education

University of the Pacific and San Joaquin Delta College are both highly ranked, and are key to providing a large, educated, and skilled workforce.

- Wage rates in N. San Joaquin Valley are generally lower than wage rates for comparable occupations in the San Francisco Bay Area. For a more comprehensive wage data analyses contact the Economic Development Division.
- The Advanced Manufacturing, Transportation, Technology, and Health and Human Services employment sectors are projected to see the highest growth rates in Tracy. Large employers in the Tracy area and the region include: Thermo Fischer Scientific, Tesla, Sutter Health, Kaiser Permanente, Amazon, FedEx, Medline, GlassFab Manufacturing, Pacific Medical, Contract Metal Products, Safeway, and Pactra.
