3. ITEMS FROM THE AUDIENCE: Alice English, Tracy resident, congratulated on a successful event at the Tracy Airport and commented on the staff and Commission working as a team on hosting the International Aerobatic Competition (IAC) at Tracy Airport. Ms. English requested the public and Commission to attend the June 20<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting to comment on the agenda item regarding the Aquatic Center.

Joe Curtis, Administrator of St. Bernard's Catholic School, addressed concerns regarding the traffic congestion on Eaton Ave. between Parker Ave. and Holly Ave. during the school bell time of Central School and St. Bernard School since Central School relocated their entrance to Eaton Ave from Parker Ave. He suggested ways to mitigate the current congestion and requested that City act immediately to prevent fatal accidents. ### RECEIVE PRESENTATION ON AIRPORT MASTER PLAN AND PROVIDE INPUT ON THE AIRPORT AND UPCOMING PROJECTS

#### DISCUSSION

#### Introduction

In May 2023, the engineering consultant, Brandley Engineering, provided the Transportation Advisory Commission with a presentation on the City of Tracy Municipal Airport Master Plan. As part of the presentation, information was provided on the process of updating master plans for airports.

#### **Master Plan Update**

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requires Airport Sponsors to update their master plan every ten to twenty years. The City of Tracy is the Sponsor for the Tracy Municipal Airport. This consists of an analysis of aviation forecasts (defining demands on the airport), analysis of the airport's ability to meet the current and future demand and areas of deficiencies, alternatives analysis to resolve the deficiencies and an accompanying development plan. This process is broken down into the following three components:

- Obstruction Survey with Mitigation,
- · Master Plan Narrative Report, and
- Airport Layout Plan (ALP) drawing set.

### **Obstruction Survey with Mitigation**

The Obstruction Survey with Mitigation illustrates to the airport and FAA any potential obstructions near the airport. This provides the airport information required to develop proposed mitigation and is essential to FAA Flight Services in updating published flight procedures for Tracy Municipal Airport to enhance airport safety. In May 2023, Brandley Engineering provided a summary of all evaluated possible obstructions designated by the Obstruction Survey and will create an Obstruction Mitigation Plan to be added to the Master Plan Narrative at time of submittal.

#### **Master Plan Narrative Report**

The Master Plan Narrative Report (Narrative) develops a plan for how the airport infrastructure will meet the future projected demands. This starts with an evaluation of future demands through the Aviation Forecasts. The Facility Requirements analysis evaluates the Airport's ability of existing facilities to meet the current and future demand based on the Aviation Forecast. The outcome of the Facility Requirements analysis is a list of deficiencies to be addressed in the Master Plan. The Alternatives Development and Evaluation considers various methods to resolve each deficiency and recommends proposed resolutions. Finally, a detailed Development Plan is created detailing the proposed future projects and project timeline complete with financial analysis.

The Airport Layout Plan is a set of drawings, approximately thirteen pages in length, illustrating existing airport facilities, existing and future FAA design standards, and future planned airport facilities for the next ten to twenty years. To be considered for an FAA grant, the project must be shown on the FAA approved overall Airport Layout Plan sheet.

Below is detailed information pertaining to the sections in the updated Master Plan that will provide the findings of deficiency, tasks to cure those deficiencies, estimated completion dates, and next steps.

The three sections of the Master Plan that detail the deficiencies on the airport are the Facility Requirements, Alternatives Development and Evaluation section, and the Development Plan.

- <u>Facility Requirements</u> This portion of the narrative includes an evaluation of each component of the airport (runway, taxiway, aircraft parking apron, hangars, access roads, parking lots, navigation aids, fueling facilities, drainage, utilities etc.) and its ability to meet FAA design standards as well as the future aviation demands based on the Aviation Forecasts. The outcome of this section of the narrative is a list of deficiencies and required improvements and/or expansions of airport facilities.
- <u>Alternatives Development and Evaluation</u> This portion of the narrative includes analysis of various alternatives to correct the identified deficiencies and selection of the optimal location, layout and/or corrective action for the main airport components. The outcome is presented on the Airport Layout Plan detailing the location, configuration, and requirements for proposed future airport development.
- <u>Development Plan</u> This portion of the narrative includes development of a listing of future projects required to correct all deficiencies and prioritization of these projects into a logical timeline that will meet the Airport's needs in a manner that accommodates the City and FAA budgets. The key component of this part of the narrative is finding a balance between maintaining the existing infrastructure, correcting items that do not meet current FAA standards and planning required future infrastructure expansion. The outcome is a detailed scope and timeline of future projects complete with cost estimates and proposed funding sources.

The Development Plan is in three phases: short term (0-5 years), midterm (6-10 years), and long term (11-20 years). Each of these proposed projects must be depicted on the FAA conditionally approved Airport Layout Plan and justified in the Airport Layout Plan Narrative Report.

#### Airport Layout Plan (ALP)

The Airport Layout Plan is a set of drawings that consists of an overall airport layout plan, larger scale terminal plans, data tables, large scale approach, and departure plans for each runway end, known obstructions maps, and the Exhibit A Airport Property Map. The overall airport layout plan sheet and larger scale terminal plans illustrate the projects the airport wishes to complete in the next five, ten and twenty years. Exhibit A Property Map is essential to document ownership of airport property and define FAA jurisdiction over said property. City staff and Brandley Engineering, the airport consultant, have been working diligently on the ALP drawing set this past year. The ALP drawing set is being presented at

the August 2023 TAC meeting with an emphasis on explaining the process of alternatives analysis for each proposed future development and resulting recommended location and layout.

### **Next Steps**

The final document will be submitted to the City in August 2023. City comments will be incorporated into the Master Plan documents. The Master Plan documents will then be finalized, a detailed quality control evaluation will be done to correct any errors or inconsistencies and the final documents will be submitted to the FAA for review. Any FAA comments will be addressed and required revisions to the Master Plan documents will be made and the final Master Plan documents will be submitted to the FAA for approval.


### **FISCAL IMPACT**







**TRACER Ridership:** A year-to-date comparison of current ridership compared to the same period in the previous year is shown below. Fixed route ridership is up 16,350 riders compared to the year-to-date ridership in June FY 21/22, an increase of approximately 19.5%. Paratransit ridership is up 4,387 riders compared to the same time in June FY 21/22, an increase of approximately 37.9%. Overall the Tracer system ridership has increased by 20,737 riders over the same period last year, an overall increase of approximately 21.7%
