3. ITEMS FROM THE AUDIENCE: John Moore, President of the Tracy Airport Association, referred to the Airport Master Plan presentation at the August TAC meeting and commented that he and others at the airport did not receive information regarding a presentation or were provided an opportunity to review the plan. He commented on other cities' marketing efforts for community participation and input in similar matters and addressed his disappointment at the City of Tracy. Requested the Airport Manager and the City do a better job of communicating and getting community input. He also stated he has not seen an improvement in the City's approach towards airport matters since his joining the airport in 2000.

Commission questions and comments followed.

Michael Thibodeau, Tracy, mentioned the increasing traffic and use of the Tracy Airport due to the convenience and easy access of the airport. He addressed the lack of basic amenities at the airport and the City's lack of support to make it great.

Alice English, Tracy, referred to the August TAC Meeting and stated it was disrespectful to airport users that they were not notified of the meeting and the Airport Masterplan presentation. Requested staff to do their job and Commission to support her request. Shared event information on the South Side Community Parade.

TRACER Ridership: A year-to-date comparison of current ridership compared to the same period in the previous year is shown below. Fixed route ridership is up 4,776 riders compared to the year-to-date ridership in August FY 22/23, an increase of approximately 34%. Paratransit ridership is up 749 riders compared to the same time in August FY 22/23, an increase of approximately 33%. Overall, the Tracer system ridership has increased by 5,525 riders over the same period last year, an overall increase of approximately 34%
