REVIEW AND APPROVE MULTI-GENERATIONAL RECREATION CENTER AND EL PESCADERO PARK PROJECT REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

DISCUSSION

In 2018, the City Council approved the Multi-Generational Recreation Center (Rec Center) as a major amenity that would be funded by Measure V sales tax revenue providing a space to serve a broad spectrum of the City's demographics, including families, teens, seniors and commuters. A new 61,300 SF recreation facility will include a 3-court gymnasium, two multi-purpose rooms, teen lounge, bouldering wall, running track, kitchen, Police Office, Parks & Recreation Offices, courtyard and deck. In addition, surrounding park improvements include a skate park, dog park, splash pad, pavilion, basketball court, nature trails, promenade, restroom and parking.

In February of 2021, the City Council hired LPA, Inc., a California Corporation to lead the design process for the new facility. On July 5th, 2022 the City Council declared El Pescadero Park as the site of the Rec Center. The project then moved into the schematic design phase. At the meeting of July 12, 2022 Parks and Recreation Department Staff and LPA provided an orientation presentation to the Tracy Arts Commission (TAC) in consideration of Civic Art projects on the exterior and interior of the facility.

Discussion continued in August and September with the TAC and Cultural Arts Division Staff, in order to provide a set of recommendations regarding the integration of public art into this facility and the surrounding area. The TAC approved recommendations including a central concept that references time, growth and knowledge as universal experiences across prioritized locations, at the meeting of October 11, 2022.

City Council has furthered development of the project, including the hiring of construction management and general contractor. Construction began in July, 2024 and a public groundbreaking event was held on September 17, 2024. The Rec Center is scheduled to open for use in 2026.

The Civic Art Subcommittee (CAS) reviewed and approved the Multi-Generational Recreation Center and El Pescadero Park Project Request for Proposals (RFP) at the meeting of October 1, 2024. The TAC is tasked to review and approve the RFP at the meeting of October 8. City Staff will continue their review and approval of the RFP as needed in preparation for public distribution in October.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total budget allocated for public art on the project is a total not-to-exceed amount of \$600,000 (six-hundred thousand dollars), which must include all aspects of the work related to the design, fabrication, and installation of the public art, for any one or up to all five locations.
