REVIEW OF MEASURE V RESIDENTS' OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE BY-LAWS

Vice Chairperson Sangha stated that he sent in his comments to staff on January 15, 2024 and on February 7, 2024. His concerns are that this is an oversight committee to review financials, forecasts etc. His concerns are, and those of community members, is that the information is put in front of the committee and then it's approved and moved forward. He stated that we want to make sure that if the committee has concerns that they will be provided with back up documentation on the numbers and one thing that he brought up was sales tax numbers. The responsibility of the committee is to present these items to the City Council and he should be able to say that he agrees with the sales tax forecast. It was noted that the city attorney confirmed that this committee only oversees the items. Vice Chairperson Sangha stated that he would like to be able to ask for additional data, information and would like to change the bylaws and would provide a red-line version to go to Council.

Finance Director Sara Cowell stated that the City Council makes changes to the bylaws and that it would be the committee's recommendation of the Council to make changes to the bylaws. She also stated that staff provides audited and unaudited actuals, and the committee is to oversee that funds are being spent as directed by the Council.

Budget Officer Felicia Galindo presented the staff report to the committee members providing a summary of the unaudited actuals for the 3rd guarter for Fiscal year 2023-24.

Committee member Arulappan inquired as to the status of Legacy Fields, and it was confirmed by Budget Officer Galindo that that project has been completed. It was stated that the City's commitment for the Aquatic Center is 55 million and the total amount is 65 million. Director Cowell stated that more information will be discussed at the upcoming April 30 City Council Meeting.

Vice Chairperson Sangha asked about interest on funds. Finance Director Cowell stated that we follow GFOA's best practices, and we don't apply interest to these due to the fact that if there was a loss on the portfolio, we would see a loss.

Finance Director Cowell stated that we don't allocate interest to Measure V, it goes to the General Fund. If there is a negative fair market value, then the General Fund takes the hit and allows for more stability.

Vice Chairperson Sangh stated that this process should be taken to the City Council to discuss.

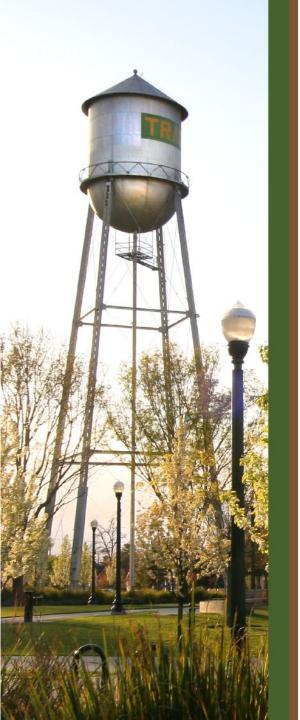

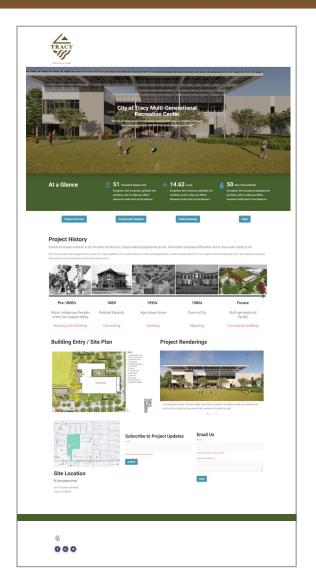

The Measure V Resident's Oversight Committee meets quarterly to review actuals from the prior quarters. The scope of this discussion is "to review the expenditure of the revenue from this transactions and use tax" " in accordance with the Committee's scope in Section 6.28.170 of the Tracy Municipal Code (TMC).

DISCUSSION

The City's fiscal year is from July 1 through June 30. The City conducts an annual audit at the close of the fiscal year. Section 6.28.160 of the TMC states "...no later than December 31st of each year, the City's independent auditors shall complete a financial audit report to include the revenue raised and expended by this tax."

Staff is still working on determining if this funding can be spent on design and/or construction. Also, there may be an opportunity to utilize other community benefit funds in the amount of \$200,000 from the Holly Commerce project.
