PHASE III and IV WATER RESTRICTIONS FOR CITY OF TRACY CUSTOMERS

Water You Doing to Conserve?



**The State Water Board mandates
the following actions be enforced.**



Addresses ending in 2, 4, 6, 8 or 0 may water on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday only.



Addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7, or 9 may water on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday only.



Outdoor watering must be kept on your property - avoid water runoff.



Unattended outdoor water use is prohibited between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily.



Turn off any non-recirculating water features or fountains.



Car washing is subject to above with use of a hose that has an on/off nozzle.



High pressure washing concrete areas, building exteriors, etc. may be done by a professional who has a city-issued business license.



Water leaks, once identified, must be repaired within 72 hours.

Restaurants are required to serve water only upon request.

Violations of the water use restrictions may result in penalties up to \$500 from the City of Tracy or the State of California.

La Junta Estatal de Aguas estipula que se apliquen las siguientes acciones .



Las direcciones que terminan en 0, 2 , 4 , 6 ó 8 pueden regar solamente martes, jueves y domingo.



Las direcciones que terminan en 1 , 3 , 5 , 7 ó 9 pueden regar solamente lunes, miércoles y sábado.



Uso de agua al exterior debe mantenerse sobre su propiedad - evite uso excesivo de agua.



Se prohíbe el uso de agua afuera de su hogar entre 9 a.m. y 7 p.m. diario sin supervisión.



Apague todos los juegos de agua o fuentes sin recirculación.




Lavar su auto está sujeta a la anterior con el uso de una manguera con una boquilla de encendido / apagado.



Se permite lavado de alta presión a las áreas de concreto, exterior de edificios, etc por un profesional que tiene permiso de negocio emitida de la ciudad.

Restaurantes solamente se requieren servir agua solamente de petición.



Violaciones de las restricciones de uso de agua puede resultar en multas de hasta \$500 de la Ciudad de Tracy o el Estado de California.

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-0506-02EE**

**ADOPTED TEXT OF EMERGENCY REGULATION
FOR STATEWIDE URBAN WATER CONSERVATION**

***Sec. 864 End-User Requirements in Promotion of Water Conservation**

- (a) To prevent the waste and unreasonable use of water and to promote water conservation, each of the following actions is prohibited, except where necessary to address an immediate health and safety need or to comply with a term or condition in a permit issued by a state or federal agency:
- (1) The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff such that water flows onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures;
 - (2) The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash a motor vehicle, except where the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle or device attached to it that causes it to cease dispensing water immediately when not in use;
 - (3) The application of potable water to driveways and sidewalks;
 - (4) The use of potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system.
 - (5) The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall;
 - (6) The serving of drinking water other than upon request in eating or drinking establishments, including but not limited to restaurants, hotels, cafes, cafeterias, bars, or other public places where food or drink are served and/or purchased;
 - (7) The irrigation with potable water of ornamental turf on public street medians; and
 - (8) The irrigation with potable water of landscapes outside of newly constructed homes and buildings in a manner consistent with regulations or other requirements established by the California Building Standards Commission and the Department of Housing and Community Development.
- (b) To promote water conservation, operators of hotels and motels shall provide guests with the option of choosing not to have towels and linens laundered daily. The hotel or motel shall prominently display notice of this option in each guestroom using clear and easily understood language.
- (d) The taking of any action prohibited in subdivision (a) or the failure to take any action required in subdivision (b) is an infraction punishable by a fine up to \$500 for each day in which the violation occurs. Authority: Wat. Code, § 1058.5. References: Wat. Code, §§ 102, 104, 105.

Sec. 865 Mandatory Actions by Water Suppliers

- (4) The term “urban water supplier,” means a supplier that meets the definition set forth in Water Code section 10617, except it does not refer to suppliers when they are functioning solely in a wholesale capacity, but does apply to suppliers when they are functioning in a retail capacity.
- (b) In furtherance of the promotion of water conservation each urban water supplier shall:
- (1) Provide prompt notice to a customer whenever the supplier obtains information that indicates that a leak may exist within the end-user’s exclusive control.
 - (2)(c)(1) To prevent the waste and unreasonable use of water and to meet the requirements of the Governor’s April 1, 2015 Executive Order, each urban water supplier shall reduce its total potable water production by the percentage identified as its conservation standard in his subdivision. Each urban water supplier’s conservation standard considers its service area’s relative per capita water usage.
 - (8) Each urban water supplier whose average July-September 2014 R-GPCD was 130 or more but less than 170 shall reduce its total potable water production by 28%.
