
Summer Energy Saving Tips-Lower Costs and earn Challenge Points

June marks the beginning of summer— a time of year for vacations, backyard barbeques and evenings spent with family and friends. It can also be a time for scorching temperatures. As the thermometer rises, often so do your energy costs for air conditioning. Here are a few tips to help lower energy costs during summer:

#### **Stay Cool**

- Set thermostat to 78 degrees or higher when at home and 85 degrees when away.
- Replace pool pumps and motors with energy efficient equipment.
- Shut windows and draw the shades to keep in precooled air.





- Check your HVAC system's air filter - dirty filters slow air flow and waste energy.
- Install a whole house fan to draw cooler air into the home and force hot air out.

#### Seal Up

- Make sure connections at vents and registers are well-sealed.
- Install a door sweep on your garage door to keep cool air in and warm air out.

#### **Additional Savings Tips**

 Turn computers and printers off at the power strip.



 Run full loads and clean the clothes dryer lint after every use.
