One of the City's highest priorities is to ensure the economic health and well being of our business community, particularly during this unprecedented economic downturn. Creating a positive business environment, attracting investment and jobs to the community, and continually improving our efforts to become the best business partner are among the highest priorities for the City. Some cities have slowed down waiting for the economy to rebound on its own. Tracy, however, has taken this opportunity to think creatively by implementing local economic

stimulus strategies, making much needed process improvements and preparing for necessary upgrades so that when the economy does bounce back, we're ready and able to assist local businesses to move forward. First, the City undertook a formal permit streamlining effort in 2008. This resulted in seven recommendations to improve our process; all of which have been implemented. Since the implementation of these recommendations, we've had very positive feedback from applicants such as Macy's, Winco, Kitchell, Anna's Linens and Walgreens. We have quickly become a pre-eminent example for other

jurisdictions to follow. Secondly, over the past two years, the City has implemented a number of targeted strategies to stimulate the local economy and job creation from both a short and long-term perspective. The City has taken positive steps to make sure that Tracy is supportive of the business community in order to create jobs and attract investments. We expect the positive feedback to continue as we partner with the business and development community to make Tracy an exceptional place to live, work and play.

Fresh at the Plaza

The Tracy City Center Association (TCCA) proudly announces the beginning of the Tracy Farmers Market by the Pacific Coast Farmers Market Association (PCFMA). The PCFMA is a non-profit organization committed to providing Californians with fresh locally grown products like fruits, vegetables, greens, nuts, herbs, berries, eggs, flowers, nursery stock and honey. Under CA Law, farmers can only sell directly to consumers like residents of Tracy rather than retailers or distributors and produce must be sold at the point of production or in any area certified by a county Ag Commissioner, hence the title, a Certified Farmers' Market. According to the PCFMA website, "Farmers' Markets are also good for the environment. They support locally grown products, rather than those grown overseas and transported to the Bay Area via ship, road or rail. Small California farmers also have been at the forefront of the organic movement, protecting soil and water quality through the restricted use of chemical agents."

The Tracy Farmers Market is held every Saturday, beginning April 16th in downtown Tracy from 9 am – 1 pm. Additionally, a special ribbon cutting will be held on Wednesday, May 11th as the market kick-off is every Wednesday evening from 4 pm - 8 pm at the Tracy Civic Center Plaza (in front of the City Hall Fountain).
