REVIEW OF UNAUDITED ACTUALS SECOND QUARTER FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

BACKGROUND

The Measure V Resident's Oversight Committee meets quarterly to review actuals from the prior quarters. The scope of this discussion is "to review the expenditure of the revenue from this transactions and use tax" in accordance with the Committee's scope in Section 6.28.170 of the Tracy Municipal Code (TMC). Due to the Governor's Stay at Home orders related to COVID-19, which delayed this Committee from meeting over the last year, this meeting will cover the prior two quarters, second quarter FY 2020-21.

DISCUSSION

The City's fiscal year is from July 1 through June 30. The City conducts an annual audit at the close of the fiscal year. Section 6.28.160 of the TMC states "...no later than December 31st of each year, the City's independent auditors shall complete a financial audit report to include the revenue raised and expended by this tax."
