6. OLD BUSINESS:

- a. Review and Discuss the 2020 Youth Advisory Commission Goals and Work Plan Vice Chair Gill reviewed the 2020 Youth Advisory Commission Goals and Objectives. Commissioner Crowley provided an update on subcommittee 1.C., to support the revitalization of the Rollin' Rec program and stated the subcommittee is working on new ideas to incorporate at the various booths. A subcommittee meeting was scheduled for February 18. Commissioner Gadamsetti, who was absent at the previous meeting, volunteered for subcommittee 2.A. and 2.B.
