5. RECEIVE PRESENTATION REGARDING CITY CODE OF CONDUCT AND COUNCIL MEETING PROTOCOLS AND RULES OF PROCEDURES

City Manager Jenny Haruyama and City Attorney Leticia Ramirez provided a training to the Committee on the City Code of Conduct and Council Protocols.

The training provided an overview of the background and the purpose of the Measure V Residents' Oversight Committee, Code of Conduct, and Council Meeting Protocols and Rules of Procedure.

Background on Measure V was provided, and Ordinance 1223, Section 6.28.170 was discussed regarding the formation of the Residents' Oversight Committee and Resolution No. 2017-026 that established Bylaws regarding the purpose and roles and responsibilities of the committee.

The Council Code of Conduct was recommended by San Joaquin County Civil Grand Jury and was adopted by City Council on October 15, 2019. The Council Code of Conduct includes a Council Advisory Body Norms and Values Statement and a form will be signed by each advisory body member affirming that they have read and understand the City of Tracy City Council Code of Conduct.

Council Protocols were reviewed. The committee was informed that the protocols apply to all City Boards and Commissions. Meetings will be conducted in accordance with the Rosenberg's Rules of Order: Simple Parliamentary Procedures for the 21st Century unless otherwise specified.

REVIEW OF UNAUDITED ACTUALS FOURTH QUARTER FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-20 AND FIRST QUARTER FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

BACKGROUND

The Measure V Resident's Oversight Committee meets quarterly to review actuals from the prior quarters. The scope of this discussion is "to review the expenditure of the revenue from this transactions and use tax" " in accordance with the Committee's scope in Section 6.28.170 of the Tracy Municipal Code (TMC). Due to the Governor's Stay at Home orders related to COVID-19, which delayed this Committee from meeting over the last year, this meeting will cover the prior two quarters, fourth quarter of FY 2019-20 and first quarter FY 2020-21.

DISCUSSION

The City's fiscal year is from July 1 through June 30. The City conducts an annual audit at the close of the fiscal year. Section 6.28.160 of the TMC states "...no later than December 31st of each year, the City's independent auditors shall complete a financial audit report to include the revenue raised and expended by this tax."
