- **5. PRESENTATION:** Ryan Niblock, Associate Regional Planner, San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG), presented SJCOG's Regional Transit Systems Plan (RTSP). He addressed concerns and questions from Commission and audience.

- 7. NEW BUSINESS:
  - a. Review and Provide Input on Commission Goals and Objectives:
  - 1.1 Staff informed Commission that the Chamber of Commerce and the Tracy City Center Association will not be taking up the reins of the Taste of the Valley Art and Food Festival-originally the Tracy Dry Bean Festival. City is looking to introduce a Blues Brews & BBQ event. Commissioner Ball asked about July 4<sup>th</sup> Fireworks event and the possibility of hosting the event at the Tracy Airport, Staff informed it is organized by Chamber of Commerce. Richard Ortenheim, Skyview Aviation, mentioned that previous events held at the Tracy Airport were a huge success and suggested the July 4<sup>th</sup> firework event at the Tracy Airport.

#### **REVIEW AND PROVIDE INPUT ON SENIOR TRANSPORTATION COMMENTS**

#### **DISCUSSION**

On July 2, 2013, recreation staff was directed by City Council to facilitate Community Conversation meetings with the public. These series of meetings would be facilitated by an outside consultant along with assistance from the Senior Steering Committee. The forum would provide seniors and community stakeholders the opportunity to identify issues that are of importance to the seniors in the Tracy community.

On December 9, 2013, the City hosted the Community Conversation Meetings with the assistance of a management consultant and the Senior Steering Committee who worked together, to identify and discuss current and future service needs for seniors in the Tracy community. The forum provided the opportunity for seniors and community stakeholders, to discuss the current strengths and opportunities for Senior services in Tracy and the current limitations and issues affecting senior services and future needs. The results of this meeting were summarized and categorized.

Additionally, the Parks and Community Services Commission held a special meeting at the Lolly Hansen Senior Center on January 12, 2015 for the purpose of gathering additional input from the senior community.

Both of these meetings resulted in various comments regarding transportation in the City of Tracy. As the Transportation Advisory Commission has purview over transportation related issues in Tracy, the comments are presented here for review and input from the commission. All items brought up at each of the meetings are listed below. The results of the discussion will be presented back to the Parks and Community Services Commission and recreation staff.

#### Comments from Community Conversation Meetings on December 9, 2013

- 1. Lack of public transportation on Sunday
- 2. Not enough bike paths
- 3. TRACER Para-transit scheduling, more information
- 4. Bus line/ services
- 5. Communication about bus services they provide
- 6. Para-transit vehicle is embarrassing to be identified with and guidelines are very stringent
- 7. Public transportation:
  - a. Inadequate routes and stops
  - b. People are limited as to how much stuff they can bring on board
  - c. Especially problematic regarding Interfaith ministries users and Larch Clover Community Center
  - d. Unused bus stop at Interfaith is needed

# <u>Comments from Parks and Community Services Commission Special Meeting on January 12, 2015</u>

- 1. Will the discontinued Tracer Bus be brought back to the Outlet Mall? Some seniors are having a hard time getting to the Senior Center from that area.
- 2. Would like to see the bus rates lowered for seniors
- 3. Commissioner Saltzman would like to know the impacts of the Tracer not being able to pick up passengers outside of the City limits, and specifically if there are impacts to people trying to get to the mall in the morning to exercise.
