<u>Transit Update</u> By Jayne Pramod

TRACER Ridership: A year to date comparison of current ridership compared to the same period in the previous year is shown below. Fixed route ridership is up 2,935 riders compared to year to date ridership in March FY17/18, an increase of approximately 2.7%. Paratransit ridership is down 166 riders compared to the same time in FY17/18, an decrease of approximately 1.2%. Overall the Tracer system ridership has increased by 2,769 riders over the same period last year, an overall increase of approximately 2.2%.
