Now that it looks as though we may be opening up soon, I feel I need to ask the Council members to address a serious problem.

During what I am assuming is a shift change at Leprino Foods, located at the corner of MacArthur and Grantline, employees rarely use the intersection crosswalk to make their way from the facility to the parking lot. Instead, they walk, or run, across Grantline, sometimes stopping in the center of the street to wait for a clearing. It's more than just a frustration. It's a serious hazard to both the pedestrian and the vehicle occupants. I deal with it several times a week on my morning commute to drop-off a child at preschool, then on to work myself.

This is particularly concerning during the fog. I have had heart stopping near misses and I'm used to it enough that I was already driving cautiously passed there. Sometimes people just bolt across.

As we look at the issue of safety related to opening our city and county, can we include the problem at Leprino? Something terrible is going to happen
